c. The period during which the services shall be performed for which bids are being solicited is from April 1st to October 31st of the years 2020, 2021 & 2022 inclusive.

C. EXAMINATION OF SITES AND DOCUMENTS

1. Bidders shall visit each site for which mowing and bed maintenance services are being solicited to become fully familiar with the access and any potential limitations of each site and to fully understand the scope of work at each site for which bids are being solicited.

2. Bidders shall fully examine all bidding documents to gain a full understanding of the requirements for bidding.

3. Failure to perform the above shall in no way entitle a bidder to additional consideration, compensation or relieve a bidder from any obligation with respect to their bid or to the Contract.

D. PREPARATION

1. Bids must be submitted on the Bid Proposal Form/Bid Price Form provided as part of the bidding documents.

2. The bidder shall not make any alterations or additions to the bidding documents provided.

3. Bidders may fill in the price blanks via ink or computer. Any corrections to any bid price must be initialed by the person signing the bid.

4. The bidders are allowed to bid on only the mowing services, only the bed maintenance services or both. If a bidder elects to bid on just mowing services or just bed maintenance services, they must provide bid prices for every site within the category.

5. No conditional bids will be accepted.

6. All submitted bids must include the Bid Proposal Form with the Bid Price Form, the Affidavit of Experience and any Certification forms included in the bid documents.

7. Partnerships shall sign in the firm name by one of the general partners. Corporations, including divisions of subsidiaries, shall state on the bid signature page the complete corporate name and be signed and attested to by authorized officers of the corporation and shall include the corporate seal. Associations and joint ventures shall include proper signatures by each person or firm.

8 Completed Bids must be received by the Frankfort Square Park District at their office at 7450 W Braemer Lane, Frankfort, IL 60423 on or before the time stated in the Advertisement for Bids. Bids submitted after the stated deadline may be returned unopened. No bids will be received via facsimile machine or by e-mail. Bids shall be submitted in a sealed envelope addressed to the Frankfort Square Park District and shall include the name of the bidder and marked as "BID FOR MOWING/BED MAINTENANCE" and the date of the opening.

E. BID OPENING AND METHOD OF AWARD

1. Bids shall be valid for sixty (60) calendar days from the date of opening and may not be withdrawn during that time period.

2. The bidder(s) and the District may agree to extend the acceptance period beyond sixty (60) days

3. The District reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any technical deficiencies and acceptable irregularities and to award all portions of a single bid or portions of multiple bids as is in the best interests of the District.

4. Upon successful approval of an entire bid or multiple bid portions, the bidder(s) agree, prior to commencing with any work, to execute an Agreement with the Frankfort Square Park District for the full three (3) seasons of services covered by the bid(s). The successful bidder(s) shall provide acceptable proof of the required insurance within ten (10) days of the District's request for such.

F. BID SECURITY/BONDS REQUIRED

No bid bond or payment and performance bonds are required.

A. BIDDING CONTRACTOR UNDERSTANDINGS & COMPLIANCE

1. The undersigned Bidding Contractor hereby offers and proposes to furnish for the bid prices quoted herein at the Contractor's sole cost, all required personnel, transportation, equipment, materials, labor, dumping fees, insurance, bonds, permits and any other items required per these bidding documents necessary to provide the specified Mowing Services and Landscape Bed Maintenance Services for the sites and time period defined and stated in these documents. Further the Contractor agrees if this Bid Proposal is accepted in full or in part by the District, the Contractor will perform the scope of work in the manner and at the times herein prescribed and in accordance with the requirements therein set forth and is fully responsible for the means of access to each site, methods, techniques, sequences and safety procedures and programs incident thereto. The Contractor agrees to perform all specified work in the Contract in a good and workmanlike manner.

2. By submitting this bid, the bidding Contractor certifies the following:

a. That the Contractor has visited the sites for which mowing and bed maintenance service are being solicited and that the Contractor fully understands the challenges and potential limitations of each site regarding the scope of work required, access to the site etc..

b. That the Contractor has fully examines all of the bidding documents and has become familiarized with all of the requirements of the scope of work.

c. That in submitting this bid the Contractor declares that the only persons or parties interested in the proposal as principals are those names herein; and that the proposal is made without collusion with any person, firm, corporation or public agency.

d. That the Contractor understands that the District reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive any and all technicalities or irregularities in a bid, to accept a bid in whole or in part and to accept a bid or partial bids that after obtaining advice from the District Board is in the best interest of the Frankfort Square Park district.

e. That the Contractor agrees to comply with all applicable codes. Laws, ordinances and regulations of the Frankfort Square Park District, Frankfort township, Will and Cook Counties, the State of Illinois and the Federal Government including but not limited to health and sanitation, age, prevailing wage, workers compensation, sales tax and equal employment as applicable.

f. That the Contractor represents and certifies to the District that it is not barred from entering into this Contract as a result of violations of either Section 33E-e or Section 33E-4 of the Illinois Criminal Code (Public Contracts). Any breach by the Contractor for the forgoing laws, regulations and rules shall constitute a breach by the Contractor of this Agreement.

B. PAYMENT

Provided the District receives invoices for monthly services rendered not later than the 1st day of the month, the District shall make payment to the Contractor no later than the thirtieth (30th) day of the same month. If the District receives applications for payment after the 1st day

of the month, the District shall make payment no later than sixty (60) days after receipt of the application for payment for services received by the District. Invoices will be received at the District office:

C. CONTRACTOR EMPLOYEES

The Contractor shall maintain policies of employment as follows:

1. The Contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, sex, national origin or age. The Contractor shall take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed and that employees are treated during employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, national origin or age. Such action shall include, but no limited to, the following: employment upgrading; demotion or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination rates of pay or other forms of compensation and selection for training including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting the policies of non-discrimination.

2. The Contractor shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees places by them or on their behalf, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employments without regard to race, religion, color, sex, national origin or age. Contractor shall also and in addition to the provision set out in this Section XIX, remain in compliance with the Illinois Public Works Employment Discrimination Act (775 ILCS 10/1 et seq.) and the Illinois Human Rights Act Article II Employment (775 ILCS 5/2-101 et seq.)

3. All Contracts for work herein are subject to the provisions of the Equal employment Opportunity Clause of the Illinois Fair Employment Practices Commission.

4. Pursuant to section 2-105 of the Illinois Human Rights Act (775 ILCS 5/1-101 et.seq.)("Rights Act"), all Contract and Subcontractors must have in force and effect a written sexual harassment policy which includes at a minimum the following provisions:

A violation of Section 2-105 is cause for the immediate cancellation of this Contract. However, any forbearance of del;ay by the Owner in cancelling this Contract shall not be construed as, and does not constitute the District's consent to such violation and a waiver of any rights the District may have, including without limitation, cancellation of this Contract. There will be no subcontractors involved in this contract.

D. REJECTION OF BIDS

The Frankfort Square Park District Board of Commissioners reserves the right to reject and refuse any or all Bids, in whole or in part, and to reject Bids of any person or firm who is debarred from the award of a contract for public works projects or who is not provided with the necessary capital, matrials, machinery or supervisory personnel to execute the work to be contracted.

E. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor shall provide proof of insurance meeting the minimum requirement as defined per the attached EXHIBIT NO.1 INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE within ten (10) days of the District's request for said insurance certificates.

F. DATE OF DELIVERY

The Contractor must adhere to the time periods of delivery of Mowing Services and/or Planting Bed Maintenance Services as set forth in the Mowing and Bed Maintenance Specifications.

G. TAXES

The Frankfort Square Park District, being a governmental body, receives statutory exemption from the Illinois Sales Tax. Therefore all bid prices that include materials should not include Illinois Sales Tax.

1. Debris Cleanup shall be performed prior to each mowing involving the removal and disposal of all encountered paper, cans, bottles, sticks, stones and other debris and objects which will present a hazard or unsightly mess if thrown from a mower during mowing operations.

2. Mowing Operations shall be performed at least once every seven (7) days, or more if needed, to maintain the turfgrass at the specified maintained height of 2 ½" to 3 ½". Turf mowers shall be rotary type and shall be maintained and in good operating order. No tractor tow behind type mowers shall be allowed for this work. As the District requires a top quality cut all cutting blades shall be maintained in a sharpened condition or replaced if needed to accomplish such. All of the Contractor's vehicles and equipment shall be clearly identified with the Contractor's company name printed on them. All equipment or tools required to perform this maintenance work within the scope of this Contract shall be provided by the Contractor shall provide an adequate number of competently trained personnel with sufficient supervision to provide the services required by this Contract. Any Contractor's employee whose actions or appearance is reasonably detrimental or objectionable to the District, shall be immediately removed from the District premises upon request by the Frankfort Square Park District.

3. String Trimming shall be performed once every twenty-one (21) days around all objects, site amenities, fencing, plant material, sidewalks or pathways where a mower cannot adequately cut all grass blades.

3. Turfgrass Clippings generated from mowing and string trimming operations may remain in place if they are evenly distributed and do not present an unsightly appearance. If deemed unsightly the clippings shall be removed and disposed of off of the District sites. No piles, windrows or blankets of clippings may remain at the completion of mowing operations.

4. Clean Up operations shall be performed at the completion of all mowing operations including the removal of grass clippings from playground surfaces, planting beds, tree rings and fences. Grass clippings shall be blown from all hard surfaces such as walkways, paths parking lots, shelters etc.

5. Scheduling consistency is desired as the District requires, whenever possible, that each site be mowed on the same day of the week from week to week during the season. If weather conditions or unstable turfgrass conditions precludes the normally scheduled mowing operations, such shall be rescheduled to the next possible day, not the regularly scheduled day of the following week. The Contractor shall make every reasonable effort to perform the required services so as to avoid inconvenience to park patrons and those participating in scheduled activities. When mowing schedule modifications are needed due to weather conditions (e.g., drought, wetness) or other needs of the District, the Contractor and the Superintendent of Parks shall confer and come to a decision based on the District's needs, on a site to site basis. Modifications in work frequency and payments may be negotiated. Such may include the District's option to require make up mowing, for missed weekly work, as an extension of services at the end of the regular season, depending on weather conditions. The Contractor shall provide the Superintendent of Parks with a schedule at the beginning of each season indicating which day of the week each site under contract will be mowed each week and shall contact the Superintendent of Parks whenever said schedule cannot be met or whenever any change, temporary or permanent, to the schedule is needed.

6. Damage to the turfgrass shall be minimized as much as possible. Care shall be taken by the Contractor to avoid ruts, scalping, tire marks from turning operations etc. The Contractor shall also avoid damage to adjacent trees, shrubs and other objects in the landscape and shall refrain from making turning marks on all hardscape surfaces including walkways, pathways, sports courts etc. The Contractor shall be responsible for the repair of any damage caused to Park District, School District and/ or neighbors' properties (e.g., fences, sheds/garages, vehicles, landscaping etc) by the maintenance operations.

LANDSCAPE BED MAINTENANCE SPECIFICATIONS

2020, 2021 & 2022 Seasons for Sites 1 thru 22

Monthly Bed Maintenance Season: April 1st to October 31st each year

Maintenance Operations Hours: Monday – Friday 9am – 5pm

A. WEED MONITORING & CONTROL IN PLANTING BEDS AND TREE RINGS

The Landscape Maintenance Contractor shall inspect all planting beds and tree rings monthly and perform appropriate weed control methods as required during the maintenance program period to provide weed free beds. Required weed control methods include the following:

1. Pre-emergent Herbicide application, in early Spring of each growing season covered by this Landscape Maintenance Contract, of a granular long term pre-emergent weed preventer herbicide (PREEN EXTENDED CONTROL WEED PREVENTER or approved equivalent). The material shall be applied according to the manufacturer's specifications. Apply prior to replenishing the planting bed and tree ring mulch.

2. Liquid Weed Killer application (COMPARE-N-SAVE WEEDD KILLER concentrate or approved equivalent,) per the manufacturer's specifications. Subsequent to the application of the preemergent week killer herbicide prior to mulch replenishment, the Contractor shall monitor all planting beds and tree rings once monthly, at a minimum, and perform weed eradication via a "controlled wand spraying" of any observed weeds. Caution shall be taken to limit the herbicide spraying to the weed plants only. Personnel applying the liquid herbicide shall be fully trained, experienced and, if required, licensed to apply the chemicals.

3. Hand pulling (mechanical removal) shall be performed only in limited situations confined to immediately prior to pre-emergent herbicide application and mulch replenishment every Spring or when a large previously undetected weed (12"tall +) has been sprayed but due to its size is unsightly.

Any herbicide use on school properties will need prior approval.

B. PLANTING BED MAINTENANCE

All landscape planting beds and tree rings designated for maintenance shall receive the following:

1. Mulch_shall be replenished during the Spring Maintenance period subsequent to the completion of the required pre-emergent week preventer granular herbicide. All beds and tree rings shall be brought up to a minimum depth of three inches (3") not to exceed four inched (4"). Mulch shall not come directly in contact with tree trunks and no "mulch volcanoes" are allowed. Much shall also be replenished during the Fall Cleanup period to maintain a three inch (3") layer over root systems going into the winter season. With prior communication mulch shall be provided by FSPD.

2. Bed Edging for all landscape beds and all tree rings adjacent to turfgrass shall be performed two (2) times per maintenance season, once during the Spring maintenance period and a follow up in July. The work may be performed manually or with a power edger. The edge cuts shall be at least two inches (2") deep.

3. Spent Spring Bulb Leaf Removal shall be performed via cutting at ground level, NOT PULLING. This operation shall not occur until the bulb leaves have ceased their provision of nutrients to the bulbs, meaning they have become limp and are yellowing or browning out. Bulb leaved shall not be cut when green and erect. All cutting shall be disposed of off the District sites.

C. PRUNING OF WOODY SHRUBS & PLANT MATERIALS

All woody plant materials should be inspected and pruned, if and as needed, once during the period of the Maintenance Contract which is March 1st –October 31st. Pruning should be performed during the proper time of the year for each plant species. In addition to the required potential annual pruning, the Contractor shall inspect from time to time all plant material while performing other routine landscape maintenance for broken branches, water shoots and sucker growth. Dead, broken or hazardous branches shall be removed promptly at all times upon their discovery throughout the period of the Maintenance Contract. During these inspection events, the Contractor shall also observe plants for any signs of diseases or insect infestations and report such promptly to the District.

Only personnel experienced in proper pruning techniques shall be utilized for the pruning operations. Proper pruning equipment shall be used and all cutting edges shall be kept properly sharpened. ONLY PRUNING THAT CAN BE SAFELY PERFORMED FROM THE GROUND IS INCLUDED IN THIS MAINTENANCE PROGRAM (i.e., pole saws & pole pruners)

Deciduous & Coniferous Shrubs should receive one (1) annual pruning for the removal of dead, diseased or injured wood. THE EXCEPTION IS THAT IN CERTAIN LOCATIONS DESIGNATED BY THE DISTRICT, SHRUBS SHALL BE PRUNED BACK AS HEAVILY AS NEEDED REGARDING HEIGHT RESTRICTIONS FOR OPEN VIEWING.

The pruning of shrubs via power shears is strictly prohibited except for designated hedges. There shall be no shearing" haircuts", "rounding off", "balls" or "balls on a stick", "hockey pucks" or any other unnatural shaping. Shrubs planted in groups shall be allowed to grow together into single masses. Additionally shrubs shall be allowed to attain their natural shape without any artificial shaping via shearing.

Only hand clippers and lopping shears both with scissor type cutting surfaces shall be used.

All deciduous shrubs shall be pruned in the Spring except those which bloom after June 30th. These types should not be pruned until after blooming has ended. The general rule of thumb for all shrubs is to prune, if and as needed, AFTER FLOWERING.

The schedule for pruning shrubs is a s follows:

a. EARLY SPRING (Early April- for non flowering shrubs and late flowering shrubs) such as:

Cononeaster acutifolia, Cornus racemose, Euonymus alatus & Compacta, Euonymus fortunei (cultivars), Hydrangeo (cultivars), Rhododendron (cultivars), Ribes alpinum, Spireas (cultivars), Viburnum dentatum, Viburnum lentago, Viburnum trilobum, Taxus (cultivars) Dwf Conifers.

b. LATE SPRING (Early flowering shrubs-blooming before June 30^{th –} prune after flowering thru June 30th)

Forsythia, Syringa, Viburnum juddii, Viburnum 'Alleghany'

c. SUMMER (June 15th – July 31st Hedges-only situation where shearing is allowed)

Ribes, Buxus, Taxus

d. FALL (October-blooms on new growth)


